The University is truly a national university with campuses spread across Pakistan; its main campus is in Islamabad and regional campuses in Peshawar, Rawalpindi, Lahore, Faisalabad, Multan, Hyderabad, Karachi, Quetta and Gwadar.

While considering the quality education at its core, NUML is reaching out to the most deprived sections of the country / students from far flung areas, neglected communities, women and children from poor families. We have multiple international collaborations on a broad spectrum of education, research, capacity building, community participation in all areas of SDGs.

We have been striving hard to improve our impact based research, business incubation and entrepreneurship activities. We are constantly making efforts to equip our students with skills useful for the communities in which they can commit themselves in a meaningful way. We are also trying to involve communities at all possible levels in an effort to become a brand, which can be relied upon to solve the problems of our society in a sustainable manner.



Due to the above mentioned focus, we have achieved *global* ranking in 601-800 band out of 1,406 institutions from 106 different countries. In SDG-4: Quality Education, NUML ranked 101-200 out of 1180 institutions; in SDG-8, Decent Work and Economic Growth, NUML ranked 401-600 out of 849 institutions; in SDG-5: Gender Equality, NUML ranked 401-600 out of 938 institutions and in SDG-17: Partnership for the Goal, NUML ranked 601-800 out of 1438 institutions.



During pandemic, the University developed Support Fund for jobless people to provide them food and medicines.










NUML Support Fund for Needy People

GOAL-2: ZERO HUNGER



Policy on Student Hunger

NUML has policy on Student Hunger; the accessibility to nutritious, balanced and healthy food is counted amongst the basic human requirements of human beings. With no exception all resources should be directed and channelized for the fulfillment of this basic need of the people. Having established this fact, the University share a burden of this responsibility and laid out a road map wherein the affected students are identified and then adequately taken care of. It is in this backdrop that a policy has been formulated.

Policy on Campus Food Waste

Food wastage has become a worldwide phenomenon. It has been estimated that nearly one third of the food produced is wasted at various stages from its production to consumption. This is a very serious issue which needs to be addressed seriously and concrete efforts are required to reduce it to the minimum. To reduce food waste, NUML has policy on Campus Food Waste.

Policy for Community Anti-Poverty Programmes in Connection with UN SDGs

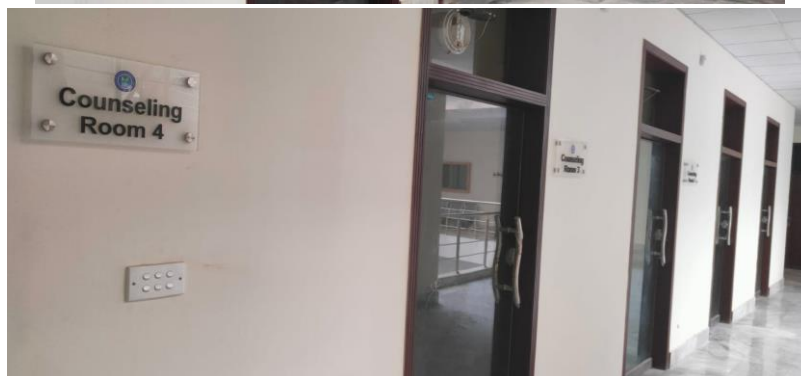


GOAL-3: GOOD HEALTH AND WELL BEING

Executive Development Center (EDC) of ORIC conducted following programs and workshops to enhance thinking ability and develop analytical skills of participants.

Faculty Development Programs (FDP) 2021

ORIC organized Faculty Development Program (FDP) based on modules, General Teaching Philosophy Development, Curriculum and Lesson Planning, Lecture Developing Techniques, Classroom Dynamics, Preparing Assessment Instruments and Teachers Self-Reflection.



Spring 2021

EDC organized a 5-day comprehensive training program from February 22-26, 2021 for the newly hired faculty members to develop insights on the latest tools and techniques being used in the field of teaching. The program also explored areas like role of a university teacher, how to develop and construct knowledge, most common class room techniques to engage students, good practices in higher education, conflict management at workplace, learning through diversity and how they can improve as researchers by using the best possible resources available in the market.

Fall 2021

Keeping in view the objectives of continuous capacity development of faculty members, EDC organized a 3-day comprehensive Faculty Development Program for the newly hired faculty members. The objective was to provide exposure on latest teaching practices and essentials of teaching in higher education. The program highlighted the importance of assessment strategies, factual feedback and importance of effective communication. The program held on September 20-23, 2021.

Miscellaneous Training Programs

Training on NVivo

EDC organized a training on NVivo for faculty members on March 25, 2021. NVivo is a qualitative data analysis (QDA) computer software package produced by QSR International. The software is intended to help users organize and analyze non-numerical or unstructured data. The software allows users to classify, sort and arrange information, examine relationships in the data and combine analysis with linking, shaping, searching and modeling.



The software helps qualitative researchers to organize, analyze and find insights in unstructured or qualitative data like interviews, open-ended survey responses, journal articles, social media and web content, where deep levels of analysis on small or large volumes of data are required.

Training on “Writing Winning Project Proposals”

The Center organized a training titled, ‘Writing Winning Project Proposals’ for faculty members to guide them how to write proposals to get projects. The objective was to increase the Research Project Profile of faculty members and to help them win grants of HEC’s programs like National Research Program for Universities, Local Challenge Fund, CPEC - Collaborative Research Grant etc.



Training on “Research Methodology: Basic Principles and Effective Tools”

The Center organized a training titled, ‘Research Methodology: Basic Principles and Effective Tools’ on July 15, 2021 for faculty members. The objective of the training was to enhance the research skills of the faculty members hired in year 2021. The training also covered different tools used for research.



2-Day Workshop on “Writing a Winning Proposal for Project”

EDC organized two-day workshop titled, ‘Writing a Winning Proposal for Project’ on August 23-24, 2021. The objective of the training was to encourage writing and developing proposals for the HEC/Non-HEC research grant programs. The training was a follow-up on the previous offering to exchange feedback and challenges that were faced by the faculty members.

Training on “Enhancing Social Capital for Faculty Innovative Behavior”

EDC organized a training titled, ‘Enhancing Social Capital for Faculty Innovative Behavior’ for the faculty members on November 02, 2021. The objective of the training was to expose faculty to innovative behaviors and how they can think out of the box in different scenarios. The program emphasized the significance of strengthening existing relationships and trust, which is an important aspect of our social capital and goodwill.

Department of International Relations organized workshop on ‘Countering the Online Disinformation’ on November 5, 2021. Mr. Asad Shoaib was the resource person.



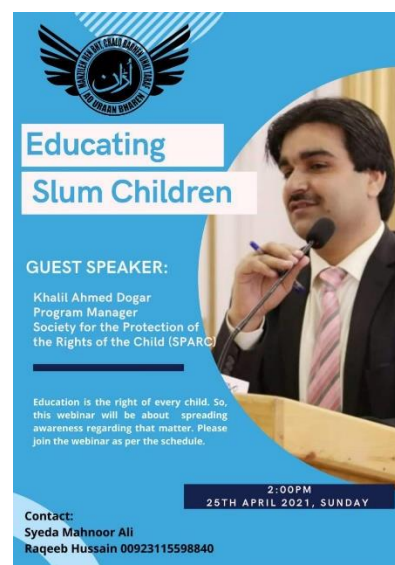
Visit of Students of University of Swat

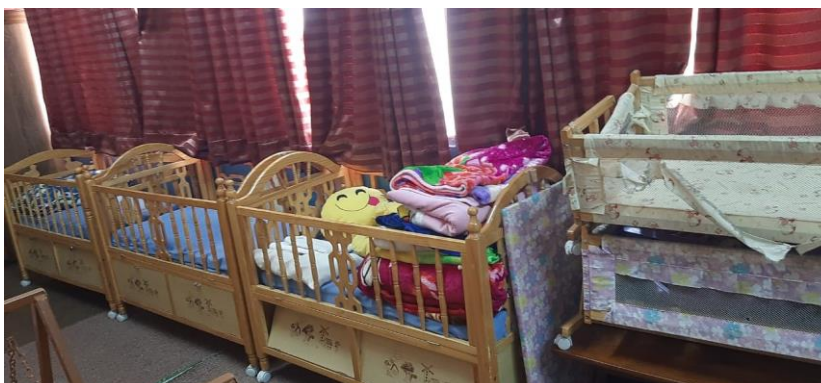
Maternity/Paternity Policy

Clean Away – A Social Action Project

Clean Away is a Social Action Project of students of Governance and Public Policy (G&PP) Department. Aim of this project is to promote waste reduction, reuse and recycling through awareness campaign. Under the project, students did various activities.

It is also known as rubbish, trash, refuse, garbage or junk.



Pakistan generates about 48.5 million tons of solid waste a year, which has been increasing more than 2 percent annually.

Reducing means choosing to use things with care to reduce the amount of waste generated. Recycling means the use of waste itself as resources.

- Diseases: (diarrhea, dysentery, cholera, intestinal problems)



Solid waste pollution is caused mainly through urbanization and through industrial waste. It causes various diseases in humans as well as deteriorate the nature.

Waste management or Waste disposal is all the activities and actions required to manage waste from its inception to its final disposal.

This includes amongst other things, collection, transport, treatment and disposal of waste together with monitoring and regulation.



It also encompasses the legal and regulatory framework that relates to waste management encompassing guidance on recycling etc.

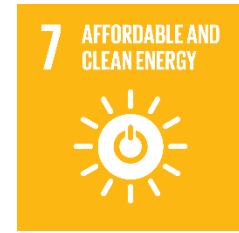


Skills Workshop for Sanitation Workers

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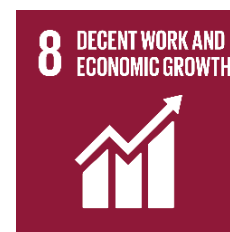

The startup provides a travelling solution at one place - making tourism much easier and safer.



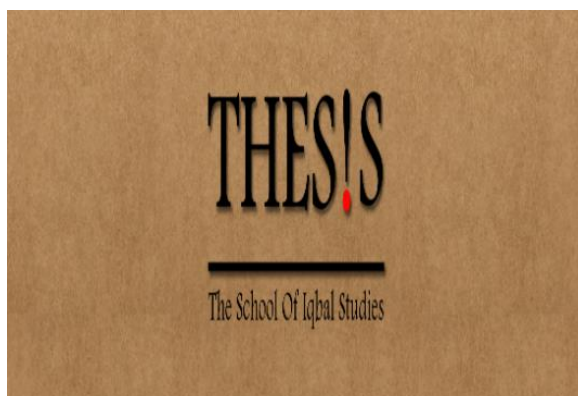
Gamify (Game Engine)

The startup shows blood donors available on real-time/live maps; it provides subscriptions for thalassemia patients to meet their future requirements, consultancy and lab testing for blood donors, and offers health care discussion forums.

Paprecious (Paper Crafting)

It is the first startup initiated in 2018 by a female faculty member, *Dr. Humaira Shahbaz*, a Senior Instructor at the Persian department. *Dr. Humaira* is the Founder, Executive Director of this enterprise. Her team members include scholars and alumni of NUML. *Ms. Zahra Shabaz* - student of BS Governance and Public Policy (G&PP) is the Co-Founder of 'Paprecious'. She is the master trainer in paper recycling skills and looks after the operations of the startup. The team collects recyclable paper, trains the artisan in paper recycling skills, creates paper crafts for socially conscious individuals and organizations, and markets them to empower the have-nots while improving the environment through a circular economy.

Smart Eco Stove provides environmentally friendly stoves; they provide support for stoves and pallets.

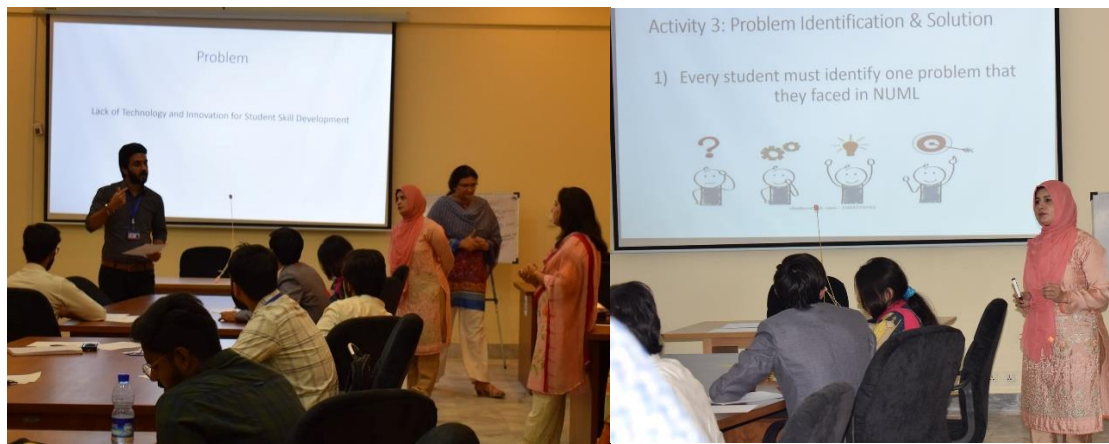

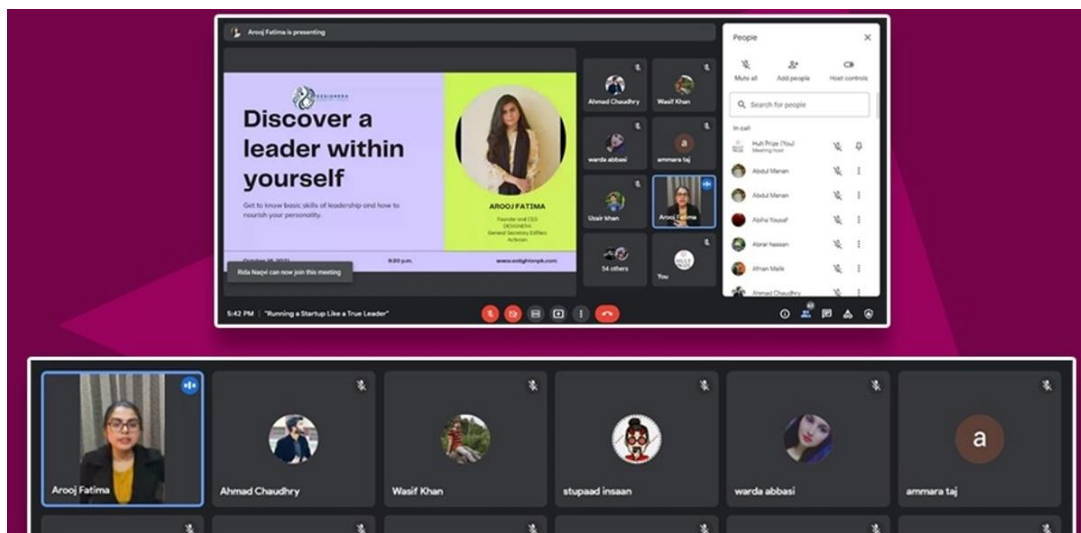

- E-Library and Theses Repository

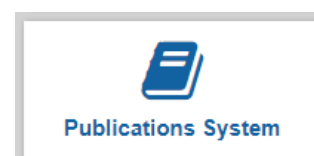
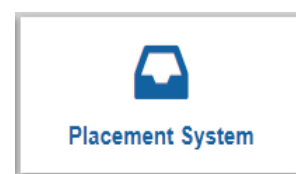
Internship / Job Placement System

The System was developed for students of three semesters (six, seven and eight) to be able to enter their academic details, expertise and area of interest. Its purpose is to facilitate students in getting internships and jobs.

Respective focal persons can view and manage student's records – they can allocate the students for the jobs shared by *Manager* Placement Centre. Campus Managers and focal persons can also access the System to process internship and job placements.

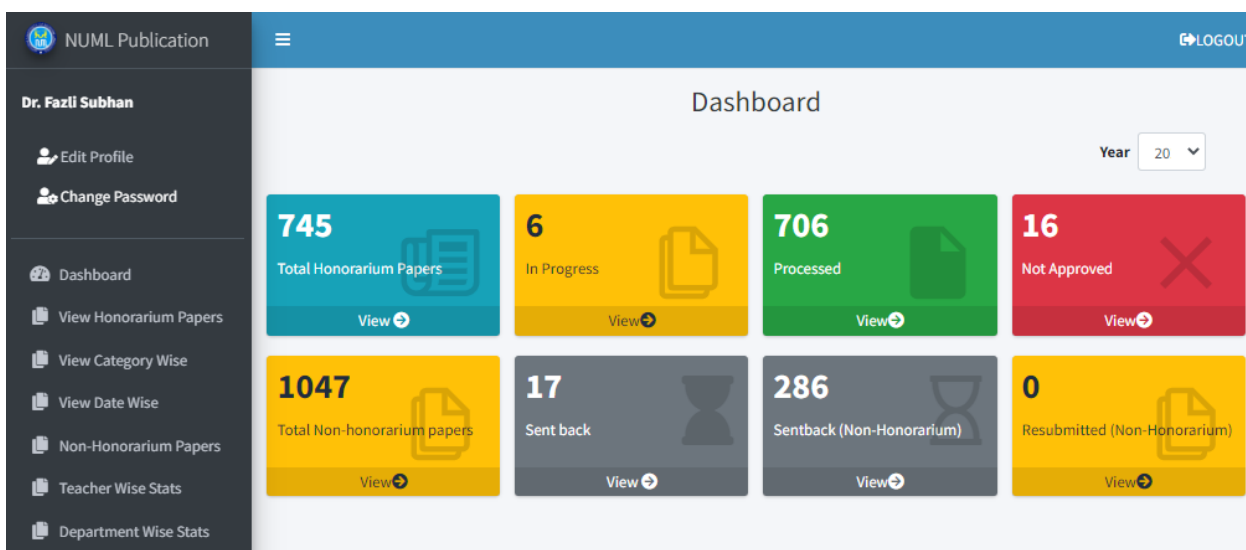
Publication System

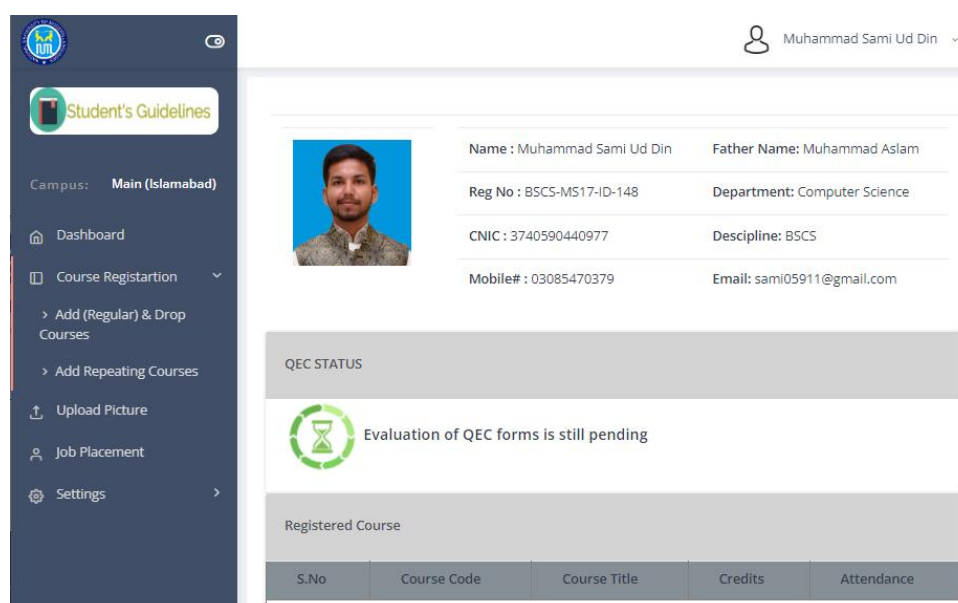
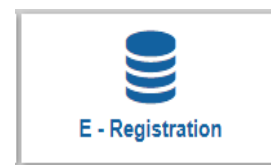

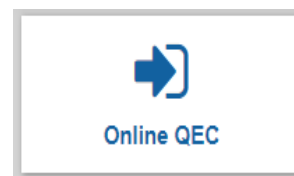
E-Registration System for Course Allocation

E-Registration System was developed for the students to register their courses online. Coordinators of Departments allocate courses offered to the faculty members. The system generates digital roll number slips to the students, which are visible to the coordinators. In the System, the coordinator can monitor attendance of students; students with low attendance are not issued roll number slips. Attendance sheets for examination are also generated from the System.

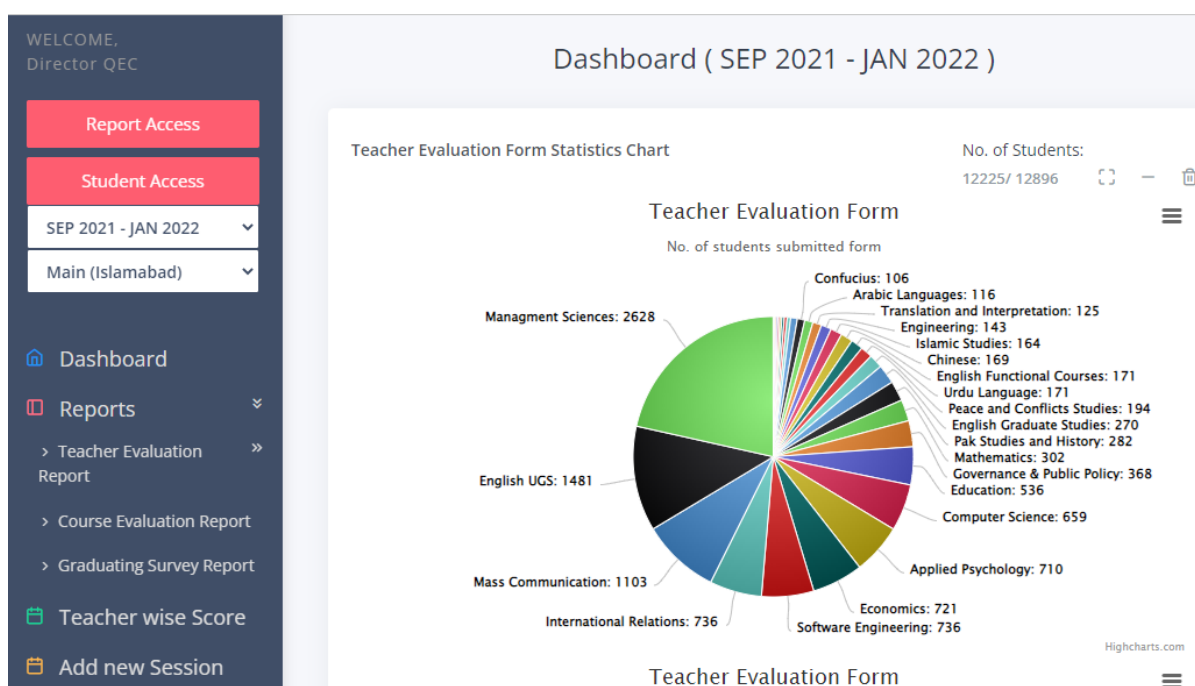


Online Feedback System for Courses & Teacher’s Evaluation

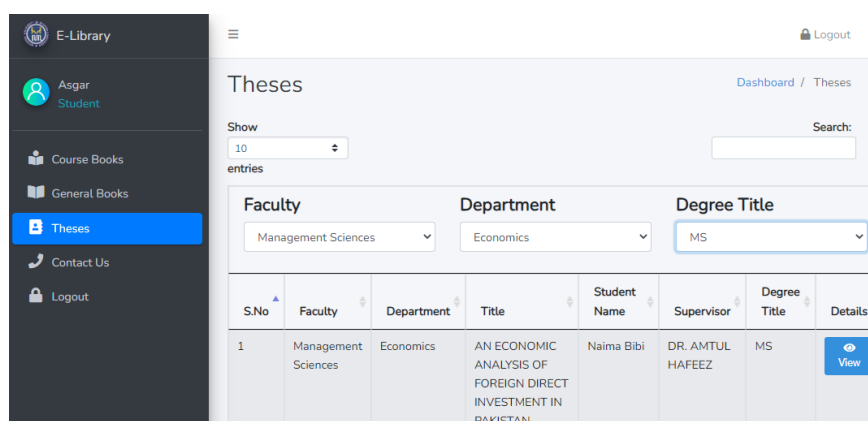

E-Library comprises the course books taught during a semester of all departments. Students can also access other recommended books online. The system was updated; now, Theses Repository offers access to theses of M.S. and Ph.D. Students of Main and Regional Campuses can access the System.

The students of Computer Science and Software Engineering Departments join Industry Technology Cell of NUML (IT CON) to flourish their programming and relevant IT skills. It helps the students of six semesters (from second to eight) to work on a specialized tool to become “Master of One” until the completion of degree.

NUML provides separate hostels to female, male and international students with amenities like reading room, space for indoor games, a lounge and dining hall with mess. University is secured with more than sixty security guards and cameras for twenty-four hours surveillance. University provides separate parking space for cars and bikes of students.



Transport

University provides transport facility to students, academic and administrative staff. There are twenty-eight buses, which cover major routes of Islamabad and neighboring cities. Almost half a kilometer from the Main Campus there is Metro Bus Stop - from where University's shuttle service picks students during both the shifts, morning and evening.

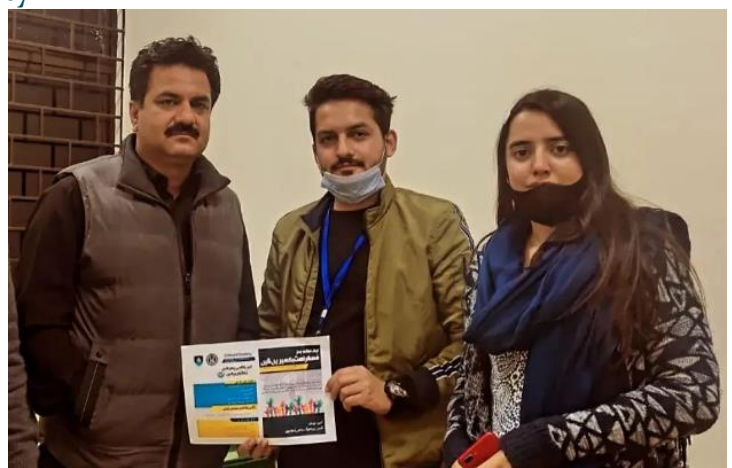
Project to Create Awareness about Air Pollution

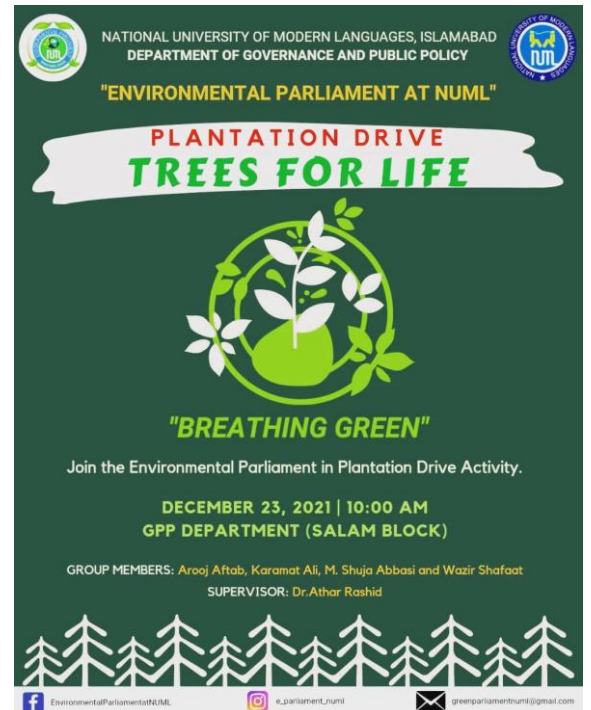
Environmental Sustainability – An Awareness Campaign
