RANKINGS

QS WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS BY SUBJECT

The *QS World University Rankings by Subject* provides a detailed evaluation of universities based on their performance in more than 50 specific academic disciplines as well as their performance in five broad faculty areas. The Rankings are considered one of the most comprehensive subject-focused rankings.



In QS Subject Rankings 2024 under the subject 'Modern Languages' NUML's rankings are:

- World Rankings: 201-250
- Asia Rankings: top 60 universities and
- National Ranking: 1.

QS WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS 2025

The *QS World University Rankings* portfolio is a popular source of comparative data about university performance. This year's QS World



University Rankings with 1,503 universities across 106 locations, up from 1500 last year. The results account for the distribution and performance of 17.4 million academic papers published between 2018 and 2022 and the 175.9 million citations received by those papers; they also account for the expert opinions of over 151,000 academic faculty and over 100,000 employers around the world.

National University of Modern Languages (NUML) has been named as one of the world's top universities, according to the twenty-first edition of the world's most-consulted university rankings. The 2025 edition of the QS World University Rankings, released by global higher education analyst QS Quacquarelli Symonds, placed NUML at 1401+ in the world and #13 in Pakistan.

QS ASIAN UNIVERSITY RANKINGS 2025

In 2009, QS launched the *QS World University Rankings: Asia* in partnership with The Chosun Ilbo newspaper in Korea to rank universities in Asia independently.



The QS Asian University Rankings 2025 ranked NUML at 481-490 out of 984 universities of Asia and 134 among Southern Asian universities. In Pakistan, NUML got ranked 27 out of 71 universities.

QS SUSTAINABILITY RANKINGS 2025

The *QS Sustainability Rankings* is focused on social and environmental sustainability performance in higher education institutions. This rankings framework highlights the different ways in which universities




are taking action to tackle the world's Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) issues.

Indicators are split into environmental sustainability measures – including sustainable institutions, sustainable education and sustainable research – and social impact measures, which includes equality, knowledge exchange, educational impact, employability and opportunities, and quality of life.

The QS Sustainability Rankings 2025 ranked NUML at 1301-1350 out of 1744 universities; 447 out of 661 Asian universities and 16 out of 34 universities of Pakistan.

TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION (THE) IMPACT RANKINGS 2024

'Times Higher Education' (THE) *Impact* Rankings - world's only rankings measuring universities' contributions to the United Nations' (UN) Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Impact Rankings assess university commitment to sustainability; progress is measured for each of the individual 17 SDGs. In the year 2023, THE evaluated 2, 152 universities from 125 countries/regions.

Webinar: Crafting Your Portfolio for Foreign Scholarships

The 'Departmental Facilitation and Support Society' (DFSS) hosted a webinar titled, "Crafting Your Portfolio for Foreign Scholarships" on March 27, 2024. The speakers were alumni from the 'Global UGRAD Exchange Program' of the Batch 2023-2024. The first speaker was *Mr. Mcaine Andrei Carlos*, a student of Multimedia Arts at De La Salle-College of Saint Benilde, Philippines, who participated in the program as a Global UGRAD Exchange student at Emporia State University in Kansas in Fall 2023.

He talked about important points to consider while writing a portfolio, such as academic achievements, extracurricular activities, skills, and experiences. 


Ramazan Drive 2024 – in Collaboration with 'Save The Humanity'



volunteers to ensure smooth execution of the














International Mathematics Day (Pi Day) Celebration


Competition: Battle of the Brains



Learning outcomes were strengthened research, communication, and creative skills while fostering awareness about global water issues.




Cleanliness drive


Goal-8: Decent Work and Economic Growth



Post Budget Seminar, 'Need for a Supplementary Budget'

The Department of Economics organized a seminar titled, 'Need for a Supplementary Budget' on September 24, 2024. Guest speaker was *Dr. Mahmood Khalid* - Senior Research Economist at the 'Pakistan Institute of Development Economics' (PIDE). He covered several key aspects of the budget:

 Overview of the Budget Process in Pakistan: He provided an overview of the budget process in Pakistan, explaining the budget preparation cycle, which involves various government Ministries and Departments in a collaborative effort.



- Constitutional Role in the Budget Process: Dr. Khalid also discussed the role of the 1973 Constitution of Pakistan in shaping the budget procedure. He highlighted the latest amendments introduced by the Public Finance Management Act (2019), which strengthens fiscal discipline and transparency. He also touched upon other relevant federal acts, such as the Fiscal Responsibility and Debt Limitation Act, which governs debt management and fiscal responsibility.
- Supplementary Budgeting: The second phase of the seminar focused on the need and requirement for supplementary budgeting in Pakistan. Dr. Khalid explained that Article 84 of the Constitution authorizes supplementary budgets when expenditures exceed approved amounts.



Challenges of Supplementary Budgeting: He noted that the need for supplementary budgeting often reflects a lack of predictability and the incompetence of relevant departments in managing fiscal resources effectively. Dr. Khalid highlighted that from 2019 to 2024, the supplementary budget has fluctuated as a percentage of the total budget, ranging from 3.25% to 9.9%. This is a concerning trend for an economy already burdened by internal and external debt.

Seminar: Design and Fabrication Process of Rigid-Flex Printed Circuit Boards

The 'Department of Electrical Engineering' organized a seminar on design and fabrication process of Rigid-Flex printed circuit boards (PCBs) on November o6, 2024. The seminar was part of the three-day Faculty Development Program that was conducted by *Engr. Ali Nisar* who is a Senior Research Officer and Project Director at National Institute of Electronics (NIE).

The seminar aimed to provide the skills necessary to effectively implement designs requiring Flex and Rigid-Flex circuits in accordance with product requirements. The seminar focussed on the impact of



these designs on manufacturing and assembly techniques. The participants were provided with the opportunity to explore PCB design software and understand how to define board stack ups and outline geometry for complex board shapes.

Seminar: Digital Integrated Circuit Design Flow



The third and final seminar of the Faculty Development Program titled, "Digital Integrated Circuit (IC) Design Flow and it's applications in Embedded Systems" arranged by the 'Department of Electrical Engineering' took place on November 08, 2024. The speaker at the seminar was *Dr. Haroon Waris*. The seminar started with an explanation of IC design flow touching on each phase in the flow. The process of digital IC functional design including hardware concepts

and functional verification was discussed. The challenges of scaling, cost and physical attributes in the semi-conductor industry were a part of the post seminar discussion.



Seminar: Underwater Communication Networks



The 'Department of Electrical Engineering' organized a seminar titled, "Underwater Communication Networks" on November 18, 2024. Director, MARS Lab, *Dr. Ali Niaz* at FAST University was the guest speaker at the seminar. Over the past decades, underwater communication mostly consisted of heavy cables that were used to establish communication between the remote underwater passages and the surface. But the burden and cost of these cables rendered limitations in underwater communication. The seminar discussed these limitations, the modern modes of communication and the nature of the underwater networks. Various applications like oceanographic data collection and underwater radio were also discussed in the seminar.







Industrial Visit to 'Islamabad Electric Supply Company' (IESCO)

A group of students of Electrical Engineering Department visited 132 KV Grid Station (located Zero Point, at Islamabad) to observe distribution the and control systems of Islamabad Electric Supply Company (IESCO). The visit aimed to enhance the student's understanding of power distribution and operational aspects of grid stations.

The students observed the switch yard including line bay, bus bar and transformer bay. The students learned







about the importance of the grounding system, overhead shielding wires used for safety and protection within the grid station. The High Tension (HT) and Low Tension (LT) sides of power transformer and transformer cooling were discussed. The visit included an overview of the 132 KV line protection panel crucial for safeguarding the power distribution system.

It allowed students to connect theoretical knowledge with practical applications in the field of electrical engineering. Special thanks to *Mr. Ahmad Ali, Mr. Amir Hayat* and *Mr. Miskeen* (at IESCO) for their guidance and support during the visit.

Seminar: AI-Based Startups

A seminar on Artificial Intelligence (AI)-based startups was organized on May 02, 2024 for the students, where *Mr. Waqas Ahmad*, the Country Head of YourMunchi, along

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Project Title: Transluminary





Enable the Disable

The project of students of 'Media and Communication Studies Department' examines

the status of disability rights in Pakistan, focusing on the legal frameworks, societal attitudes, and systemic barriers affecting individuals with disabilities. Despite Pakistan's ratification of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) in 2011, challenges persist in translating international commitments into effective national policies.

The project analyzes key legislation, such as the Disabled Persons (Employment and Rehabilitation) Ordinance 1981 and the ICT Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2020, assessing their impact on employment quotas and accessibility standards.



Additionally, the research explores cultural perceptions and stigma associated with disability, which often hinder social inclusion and equal opportunities. By evaluating the roles of governmental bodies, non-governmental organizations, and advocacy groups, the project identifies gaps in implementation and enforcement. The findings aim to inform policy recommendations and advocacy strategies to enhance the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities in Pakistan, promoting a more inclusive and equitable society.

Adapting Physical Education for Special Populations

The seminar titled, 'Adapting Physical Education for Special Populations' was organized for BS HPE students on April 17, 2024. 




Literature and Life - Writing as an Expression of Identity and Collective Culture

The 'Media & Communication Studies Department' hosted a fantastic TV Production Workshop: TV & Digital Media Viewing Experience today on April 30, 2024.



He performed his duties as interpreter for the delegation throughout their stay including their meetings with Chairman Senate, Chairman Senate





MoU with Fauji Foundation Overseas Employment




