

2. Unveiling the Psyche: The Students of NUML Explore Ted Morrissey's short story Vox Human

'Vox Humana'
 A Casebook

A Project Focused on the Short Story "Vox Humana" by Ted Morrissey

When fiction becomes a mirror for the unconscious, interpretation becomes an act of discovery- an intellectually rich collection of psychoanalytic interpretations that bridges fiction and academic inquiry. This compelling volume is the result of a collaborative effort between Dr. Amina Ghazanfar of NUML Islamabad and acclaimed author Ted Morrissey. Compiled during the Fall 2024 semester, the casebook features analytical essays from undergraduate students who closely examined Morrissey's short story, "Vox Humana." Employing critical frameworks such as Freudian, Lacanian, Jungian, deconstructionist, feminist, and postmodern theory, the students offered multidimensional insights into the mental and emotional depths of the protagonists of the story, Harry Gale and his sister Annette, transforming the story into a literary case study of the human psyche. At the heart of this project lies the remarkable intellectual energy of the student contributors, whose sharp analytical skills and creative interpretations give this work its voice. Their essays showcase a keen understanding of psychoanalytic thought while fearlessly engaging with the story's emotional complexity and symbolic depth. In recognition of their academic excellence and contribution, the university formally appreciated their work in a dedicated ceremony where certificates of achievement were awarded. This celebration not only honored their scholarly commitment but also highlighted the role of critical thinking in literary exploration.
